#### **New Honorary Fellows**

The College is delighted to announce the election of Professor Curtis McMullen (1980), Maria Moors Cabot Professor of Mathematics, Harvard University, and Moira Wallace OBE (1979), Provost of Oriel College, Oxford, as new Honorary Fellows.

#### Sad news

It is with regret that the College announces two deaths: Dr John Clarke, who taught anatomy in the College from 1994 to 2013, died on 19 March. Then on 9 April we learned of the death of Professor Sir James Holt, Honorary Fellow of the College, and Fellow from 1978 to 1981. Sir James was also Master of Fitzwilliam College from 1981 to 1988.

# **Emmanuel Chefs win more awards**

Showcasing culinary skills and talent from many universities across the UK, the annual TUCO Competitions took place in Blackpool in March this year. In the chefs' Challenge Team Event competitors were given a mystery box of ingredients and challenged to prepare a three course meal for two. Twenty-two teams of two took part and Emmanuel's Nathan Aldous and team-mate Byron Franklin were named winners.

Five of the seven Cambridge team at the TUCO competitions were from Emmanuel. Dan Abbs won silver in Class Plated Dessert and gold in Class Coffee Shop Cake, Matthew Carter won gold in Class Plated Main and silver in Class Fruit Pie and Tony Maio won silver for Canapés.

## **Chapel Choir CD**

The Chapel Choir have just released a CD: Vox Dicentis: Choral Music by E W Naylor is available for £10 + £2.50 p&p. Cheques should be made payable to Emmanuel College Cambridge and sent to Chapel Choir CD, Emmanuel College, Cambridge CB2 3AP.

Edward Woodall Naylor (1867–1934) was Organist of Emmanuel from 1898 until his death. Apart from his well-known anthem *Vox Dicentis: Clama* and a few canticle settings, very little of his music is known or in the repertoire of choirs today. This is the first recording entirely devoted to his choral works, and contains seven first recordings. It is directed by Richard Latham (1997).

## Lent Bumps 2014

Four Emma crews competed in the Lent bumps races and, despite some very disrupted training due to adverse weather conditions and river closures, performed very well. Due to restrictions on training this term none of the lower boats qualified for bumps, despite a strong performance in the Getting on Race from M3. Both W2 and M2 had difficult weeks, competing with college first boats that had been able to train on the water significantly more than themselves. Despite this, M2 rounded off their week with a decisive bump on Anglia Ruskin and both crews had a thoroughly enjoyable week. However the main successes of the week came from the first eights. W1 bumped up twice into second place, before chasing down First & Third on the final day for women's headship. By the finish line they had closed significantly and reduced the deficit to half a length; we can only lament that the course was not another 500m longer, in which case they would have surely secured another Lents Headship. Last year M1 had a dismal bumps, spooning (being bumped every day), and falling into the second division. With half of last year's crew racing again they were determined to right a wrong and did this is spectacular style, bumping up four places and therefore being awarded their blades.
