British Academy

Congratulations to our Honorary Fellow Professor John Lowden on his election as a Fellow of the British Academy at their Annual General Meeting on 18 July 2013. President of the Academy, Lord Stern, said 'Our new Fellows, from across the UK and world, are world-class experts in the humanities and social sciences and can play a vital role in sustaining the Academy's activities – helping select researchers and research projects for funding support, contributing to policy reports and speaking at the Academy's public events.'

Royal Geographical Society

More congratulations for College Fellow Professor Keith Richards, who was awarded the Founder's Medal by the Royal Geographical Society on 3 June 2013. Approved by Her Majesty The Queen, the medal recognises excellence in geographical research and fieldwork, teaching and public engagement.

New Generation of Thinkers

John Gallagher (2009), a PhD student at Emmanuel, has been named one of ten New Generation Thinkers of 2013 by BBC Radio 3 and the Arts & Humanities Research Council. The scheme is designed to find academic broadcasters of the future, and John will spend a year with Radio 3 presenters and broadcasters developing his research on foreign languages in sixteenth- and seventeenth-century England into Radio and TV programmes.
