REGIONAL EVENTS IN THE UK

Visit to Wotton House near Aylesbury – Saturday 6 June

We are very privileged to have a private tour of Wotton House, Wotton Underwood, Aylesbury HP18 0SB on Saturday 6 June.

Wotton House was built in 1704 by Richard Grenville, descendant of a long line of Grenvilles who lived in the parish of Wotton Underwood since soon after the Norman Conquest. The elevation was almost identical to that of Buckingham House (later Buckingham Palace) which was being built at the same time and the architect may have been John Fitch, who built part of Buckingham House.

Grenville employed the leading landscape architects of the day, George London and Henry Wise, to lay out formal gardens and double avenues to east and west of the House. In mid-century George Grenville, later Prime Minister, brought in Capability Brown to help his brother-in-law, William Pitt the Elder, create a new landscape which is now being restored.

In October 1820 the house burned down and Richard Grenville, 2nd Marquess of Buckingham, immediately commissioned John Soane to rebuild it. Soane lowered the house, removing the top floor completely and fitting a new top floor behind the old entablature. He also substantially altered the layout of the rooms, inserting a north-south corridor, and created a full-height atrium (or “Tribune”, as he called it) in the hall.

After the death of the third Duke of Buckingham in 1889 Wotton, like Stowe (which had been the main Grenville house since 1749), was let, and sold in 1929. In 1957 the house was within two weeks of demolition when it was found by chance by Mrs Patrick Brunner, who engaged the architect Donald Insall to restore it. It is now more or less as Soane left it, apart from the ‘Tribune’, which is now being restored to its original state.

Wotton House has been featured three times in *Country Life* and was the subject of a major exhibition at the Soane Museum in the summer of 2004.

We will meet at 10.30am for coffee and then a tour of the house. We will visit the grounds after a sandwich lunch and end with tea.

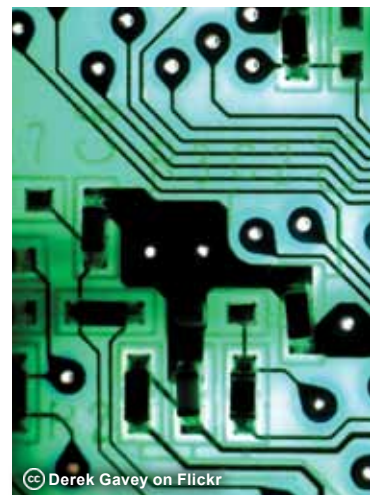
