#### **NEWS**

#### **Fellows' Publications**

- Dr John Harvey has discussed his book The Story of Black on BBC Radio 4's Thinking Allowed and BBC Radio 3's The Verb. The Story of Black was published in paperback by Reaktion Books on 13 July.
- Professor Barry Windeatt's translation into modern English of Revelations of Divine Love by Julian of Norwich (1342– c.1416) – the earliest identifiable woman writer in English – has been published in the Oxford World's Classics series.

#### **Fellows' Promotions and Awards**

Six Emmanuel Fellows and Bye-Fellows have been recommended for academic promotions:

- Professorships for Dr Catherine Pickstock, Dr Catherine Rae and Dr Christopher Burgoyne
- · A Readership for Dr Alex Jeffrey
- Senior Lectureships for Dr Chris Whitton and Dr Stephen Barclay
- Professor Christopher Hunter has been elected an Honorary Member of the Royal Irish Academy. Professor Hunter was officially admitted to the Academy at a ceremony in Dublin on Friday 29 May.
- Professor Sylvia Richardson, Director of the Medical Research Council Biostatistics Unit, has been elected to a Fellowship of the Institute of Mathematical Statistics for her influential research in spatial statistics, hierarchical modelling, mixture models; for applications in biomedical science, epidemiology and genomics; and for her service to the profession.
- Following the publication in March of his latest book, Landmarks, Dr Robert Macfarlane has been awarded two prizes. The Royal Geographical Society's Ness Award recognises an outstanding contribution to geography, in this case through 'innovative writing on landscape, place and nature'. Dr Macfarlane has also won the Premio ITAS, the world's oldest prize for mountain literature, for his book *The* Old Ways.
- Dr Laura Moretti has received a CUSU Student-Led
  Teaching Award: an opportunity for students to recognise the
  exceptional contribution their teachers have made to their
  education at Cambridge.

#### **Boat Club**

The May Bumps showed mixed success for the Emma boats: the Men's I boat stayed 12th on the river after skirmishes with Peterhouse and Christ's, the III boat contributed to St Catharine's fall down the rankings, and remained at 3rd in the 3rd Division.

The Women's I boat rowed over comfortably all days, staying 3rd overall on the river, the II boat fell from 6th to 9th after being bumped by Fitzwilliam, Homerton and Pembroke II. The III boat bumped Selwyn II boat, rowed over twice and remained at 8th in the 3rd Division after being bumped by First & Third II.

The Boat Club had a fantastic day at the Nines' Regatta on Sunday 24 May. The Women's First Boat took the women's prize and the Men's First Boat won their plate final against Magdalene. The Men's Fourth Boat lost out to Clare Hall by just 1/4 length before beating two Clare boats to win their Plate Final. Emma was the club with the most wins on the day.

#### **Chapel Choir**

In June the Chapel Choir spent two successful days recording Christmas carols for Imagem Productions/Boosey & Hawkes. The recording was produced by a former member of the choir, Arun Sethi (2004).

#### **Access**

In June, Year 12 students from two schools in Essex came to Emmanuel for a day of talks, tours and a supervision-style session. The visit was part of a programme organised by an educational charity, The Brilliant Club.

At the beginning of August, 33 students from schools in Sheffield spent four days at Emmanuel learning more about university life. As well as attending taster lectures and exploring the University Library, students took part in classes at the Archaeology and Physiology Departments.
