

EMMANUEL COLLEGE CAMBRIDGE HERCHEL SMITH TEACHING AND RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP IN MEDICINE

FURTHER PARTICULARS

The Governing Body of Emmanuel College invites applications for a Teaching and Research Fellowship in Medicine, tenable for five years from the 1 October 2025.

The Fellowship is intended for outstanding researchers early in their careers. Applicants will normally be expected to have some undergdauate teaching experience, commensurate with the stage of their career. For the Fellowship in Medicine the expectation is that the appointed person would be able to supervise at least one paper in the first two years of the Medical Sciences Tripos. Applications from those working in the fields of neurophysiology and reproductive biology, with an interest in teaching these subjects would be particularly welcome. Applicants will normally be expected to have had some post-doctoral experience, and to have carried out at most ten years of post-graduate research and teaching since gaining their bachelor's degree. The Fellow will undertake an independent programme of research. For laboratory projects, applicants must arrange a host laboratory in the Cambridge area before applying.

The stipend for the Fellowship will be between £36,804 and £38,555 per annum, depending on whether the Fellow is pre- or post-PhD. Applicants not yet holding a PhD should expect to submit their thesis for examination before the 1 October 2025. In addition to pursuing their personal research, the Fellow will be required to teach (typically in small groups of students) for six hours per week for Emmanuel College during Full Term and to participate in the annual selection of undergraduates at Emmanuel College for degrees in Medicine.

Additional payments are made to the Fellow for supervisions undertaken in excess of 120 hours per year, and for directing studies. The Fellowship will include a start-up grant for the purchase of computing and research equipment. Additional benefits for the Fellow include annual grants of up to £2,500 for academic travel and general research expenses, as well as £280 for the purchase of academic books. The Fellow will also have the option to live in College, for which there is a service charge, and will be provided with lunch and dinner in Hall free of charge.

Candidates must also arrange for two referees, who are familiar with their research, to send references directly to Carey by the same deadline. It is the candidate's responsibility to ensure these references are received on time. Shortlisted candidates will be asked to provide their three most significant publications and a brief research proposal prior to the interview.

Interviews will take place in person on Wednesday, 25 June 2025.
