# COLLEGE COMMUNITY GARDEN LAUNCHES

In the Spring issue of the *Newsletter*, we told you of the vision for the college's new community garden. We're pleased to report that much of the infrastructure is now in-place, situated behind three houses on Park Terrace, and the first shoots and seedlings are emerging, some very quickly indeed!

The gardens were celebrated with a 'soft launch' event with words from the Master, Doug Chalmers, and the college's Head Gardener, Brendon Sims, who championed the project from the outset.

Gardening can be an important tool for students, Fellows and staff to relieve stress, contribute to the Emma community and approach life more mindfully, Brendon believes. The gardens will, he hopes, be a place to slow down and appreciate life's little joys.

'Mental health and gardening are always at the forefront of my thinking,' says Brendon. 'When the project reaches its final stages, it will give the community a non-hierarchical

# Swimming resumes at college pool

The college's swimming pool has undergone extensive refurbishment over the last year. A new lining and skimmer, suction and return points, and associated updates to the plant room and electrics systems have been completed over the unusually wet winter and spring months.

David Hobbs, Buildings Manager, said: 'work has required a large trench to be formed for the pipework to come from the plant room to the pool skimmers. Additionally, new lining has been installed and the thatched roof on the changing hut replaced.'

With the work having taken longer than originally hoped following the disappointing weather, happily the reopening of the pool coincided with a much warmer spell, enabling our graduands to make full use of it in the few days prior to their ceremony.

The new thatched roof is topped with three duck finials, a playful nod to Emma's famous avian friends. Work to update the changing hut will follow.
