CLEAN SWEEP ON THE RIVER AND THE PITCH

Cambridge celebrated an incredible run of sporting success at both the *Oxford and Cambridge Boat Race* and *Blues Varsity* football over the last term. These victories were a great source of pride for the College community, with Emmanuel students placed in almost all the winning boat crews and the winning men's and women's football squads.

Six Emmanuel students were on the Thames this year, a record number for the College and the largest number of athletes participating from a single college (joint with Peterhouse). All triumphed in their respective races.

In March, the inaugural *Vincent Lumsden Society* dinner was held in College. The Society, co-founded by Amber Morrison (2022) and Shea Williams (2022), students of Medicine and Human, Social & Political Sciences respectively, aims to celebrate and support the Black community at Emmanuel through welfare, representation and outreach.

Vincent Lumsden (1952) is a former cricket player, agronomist and broadcaster. Coming up to Emmanuel from his birthplace of Buff Bay, Jamaica, Lumsden's life and legacy serves as inspiration for those behind the Society launched in his honour.

Fellows, students, members and staff enjoyed a convivial reception in the Old Library with talks by Morrison and Williams, the Master and Dr Carol Brown-Leonardi, Founder and Chair of the African Caribbean Research Group, followed by dinner in Hall.

EMMA ENTERPRISE COMPETITION WINNERS

The *Emma Enterprise* Lab and Competition, now in its second year, is an extra-curricular opportunity for students to develop core enterprise skills including forming ideas, market research, developing business plans, pitching and raising finance, and then put these skills to work in a team-based venture-creation exercise.

The initiative, produced by the *Emma Experience* programme, is supported by experts and practitioners from the Emmanuel community and Cambridge innovation ecosystem, who generously provide mentorship to the teams and judge the final pitches.

This year's winners were IntolerSense, a team led by current PhD student Lukas Pin (2022) and mentored by Damian Crowther (1986), with their concept of a mobile application that helps people track and understand the symptoms of their food intolerances. The technology relies on a pattern

recognition algorithm, identifying recurring combinations of symptoms across users to enable faster, more accurate insights, with the ultimate goal of supporting more personalised treatment plans with less trial and error.

Young's Court wins RIBA awards

Emmanuel's Young's Court development has won two prizes at the 2025 Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) East awards, including 'Building of the Year'. The largest single building project at Emma for over a century, Young's Court addresses the College's long-held aspiration to accommodate all its undergraduates on-site for the first three years of their degrees.

The architects behind the design, *Stanton Williams*, created a beautiful space that has quickly become a vibrant and much-loved hub of activity for students, Fellows and staff. Part new-build and part retrofit, the scheme introduced new social and informal study areas, as well as residential provision.

The project is one of the fruits of the decade-long *Emma Enables* campaign, which was supported by more than 3,000 donors, for whose generosity we are extremely grateful.

Leading voices in politics and international relations speak in College

The College welcomed two leading voices from the world of politics and international relations during Lent term.

The 1584 Society, Emma’s student-led politics, policy and economics society, invited Pippa Crerar, one of the UK’s top political journalists, to share insights from her experiences of ‘holding power to account’ in a behind-the-scenes look at the stories that changed, and continue to shape, politics in the UK.

In February, this year’s *Gomes Lecture* saw The Rt Hon. the Baroness Ashton of Upholland LG GCMG speak on rapidly changing geo-political landscapes with the perception and clear-sightedness of a veteran diplomat. Baroness Ashton, a British Labour politician who served as the High Representative of the Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy and First Vice President of the European Commission from 2009 to 2014, addressed a full lecture theatre of Fellows, members and students.
