## Emmanuel College Chapel

**The Chapel** exists as a centre for Christian life and worship.

It stands in the centre of the College as a reminder of the spiritual dimension to life, whether we are conventionally religious or not. All members of the College and their friends are very welcome at its services, and are invited to share in its activities.

### Regular Services

#### **Sunday 6 pm – Evensong**

Evensong is service of words – words sung, prayed, read and preached. It is the traditional service for evening and is led by the Choir. It includes a sermon, often given by a visitor to the College, designed to promote thoughtful reflection on the Christian Faith and the issues that it raises. The service is followed by drinks in the Old Library, where there will be a chance to meet the preacher.

#### **Wednesday 9 pm – Compline**

Compline is an atmospheric candlelit service for late evening taking different forms through the term. It is followed by port and chocolate in the Dean's rooms.

#### **Thursday 6 pm – Sung Eucharist**

The Eucharist is the distinctive act of the Christian community. In it the scriptures are read and expounded and the central events of Jesus' death and resurrection are re-presented in bread and wine. The service lasts about 45 minutes, finishing before the end of informal hall.
