Folly in Foreign Policy

Sir Sherard Cowper-Coles will be giving a talk in College on Wednesday 13 February called *Folly in Foreign Policy: an Afghan Case Study*. Sir Sherard served as the Foreign Secretary's Special Representative for Afghanistan and Pakistan from February 2009 until September 2010, working opposite the late Richard Holbrooke. He took early retirement from HM Diplomatic Service in October 2010, and started worked in February 2011 as the Business Development Director, International, of BAE Systems plc.

His book about his three-and-a-half years working in and on Afghanistan, *Cables from Kabul*, was published by Harper Collins in May 2011. His second book, of stories of three decades in the Foreign Office, *Ever the Diplomat*, was published on 25 October 2012.

Professor Christie Davies (1961) will be giving a talk entitled *Taking Jokes Seriously*, on Wednesday 27 February in the Queen's Building at 5.30pm. Professor Davies is Professor Emeritus of Sociology at the University of Reading. He is the author of many articles and books on criminology, the sociology of morality, censorship and humour. His main research and teaching interests are in the comparative and historical study of morality and of humour. His latest book, *Jokes and Targets*, was published in 2011 by Indiana University Press.
