## NEWS

### Access

Over 650 students from 28 schools in Essex and Sheffield have visited this term. They have enjoyed meeting current students and learning about life in Emmanuel as well as attending talks at the Sedgwick Museum of Earth Sciences and Museum of Classical Archaeology. The College has also welcomed younger visitors: Year 6 students from Millhouse Junior School in Basildon met Emmanuel undergraduates before discussing polar expeditions at the Scott Polar Research Institute.

It has also been a busy term for staff, Fellows and students. Dr Phil Howell met teachers from Essex in Chelmsford while Dr Nick White discussed university life and admissions with teachers in Sheffield. The College Shadowing Scheme ran for a third time in October. Ten Year 12 students from Essex and Sheffield stayed for three nights and shadowed ten Emmanuel host students. 'Shadows' attended lectures and supervisions with their hosts, academic taster sessions and a formal dinner. Many still found time to try College sports teams and visit the ADC.

Next term looks set to be as busy as ever with Subject Stretch Days planned for Year 12 students in Essex and the College set to host 12 Challenge Days for Year 10 students. We also look forward to the launch of our Access Twitter account in the coming weeks.

### Burnaby Recitals

- Friday 30 January 2015, Queen's Building: the Cavaleri Quartet ([cavaleristringquartet.co.uk](http://cavaleristringquartet.co.uk)) will play:

Since its formation in 2008, the Cavaleri Quartet has gained a reputation as one of the leading European string quartets. They have won several prizes, most recently the second prize at the Osaka International Chamber Music Competition 2014.

Richard Hills FRCO is one of the very few musicians to have truly mastered the divide between the world of the classical organ and that of the theatre organ. He is a freelance organist and Organist at St Mary's, Bourne Street. He has won numerous prizes and awards and appeared many times on national and international radio and TV.

The recitals start at 6.30pm and last for 45 minutes. All are welcome and admission is free.

### The Global Financial System – talk by Lew Kaden

Lew Kaden (1963) will give a talk in the Queen's Building at 5.30pm on Friday 27 February. His title is: 'Challenges facing the global financial system over the next decade'. Lew was the Lionel de Jersey Harvard Scholar at Emmanuel in 1963–64. He is former Vice Chairman of Citigroup and currently Lead Director of ArcelorMittal and John Harvey Gregory Lecturer on World Organization at Harvard University. All are welcome.

### Intellectual Property Lecture 2015

The annual intellectual property law lecture in 2015 will be held on Tuesday 10 March at 6pm in the Queen's Building. The speaker will be Professor Pamela Samuelson and her topic will be the protection of software by patents and copyright.

Pamela Samuelson is the Richard M. Sherman '74 Distinguished Professor of Law and a Professor of Information Management at the University of California at Berkeley. She is also a Director of the Berkeley Center for Law & Technology. She has written on the challenges that digital technologies pose for existing legal regimes, particularly intellectual property law, and has become interested in legal regulation of digital networked environments.

You can also hear them on their latest CD: *Vox Dicentis: Choral Music by E W Naylor* is available for £10 + £2.50 p&p. Cheques should be made payable to Emmanuel College Cambridge and sent to Chapel Choir CD, Emmanuel College, Cambridge CB2 3AP. Edward Woodall Naylor (1867–1934) was Organist of Emmanuel from 1898 until his death. This is the first recording entirely devoted to his choral works, and contains seven first recordings. It is directed by Richard Latham (1997).
