

EVENTS AROUND THE UK

Visit to Moira Furnace, Swadlincote, Leicestershire DE12 6AT – Thursday 2 June

Members are invited to a family half-term event at Moira Furnace, a museum in the former 1804 iron-making blast furnace, on Thursday 2 June.

The Emmanuel Society will be visiting the National Forest, an environmental project in central England run by The National Forest Company, and will be at the New Inn at Peggs Green LE67 8JE for a lunch for Members from 12 noon.

In the afternoon there will be a museum tour of the Moira Furnace at 2pm, followed by a boat ride along the nearby canal, which carried the Furnace's raw materials and products in the nineteenth century (£7.50 for adults, free for children 16 and under).

In the area there is Ashby de la Zouch castle (between the New Inn and Moira Furnace), the Ashby Woulds Heritage Trail (5.7km) in the Country Park, with geocaching activities and an adventure play complex for toddlers and older children. The canal offers fishing permits (day permit £5) and there is a wildflower meadow near to the Furnace complex for walking.

Visit to see portraits of the Founder's family at Fulbeck, Lincolnshire – Tuesday 5 July

Julian Fane (1959) and his wife, Julia, have very kindly invited the Society to visit their home in Fulbeck, Lincolnshire, on Tuesday 5 July. Julian is a descendant of the College's founder, Sir Walter Mildmay, and he has a fine collection of Fane family portraits to see.

The *Lincoln Gazette* in 1900–09 describes Fulbeck as 'one of the prettiest villages in Lincolnshire, see it how we may' and those attending might wish to explore the village, its church, medieval cross and craft centre, before joining the Fanes for a light lunch at 12.30pm.

After lunch, Julian will show the party his house and the portrait collection.

Emmanuel Society visit to Hillsborough Castle, near Belfast – Saturday 29 October

The Society has arranged a visit to Hillsborough Castle, near Belfast on Saturday 29 October. The late Georgian mansion was built in the

1770s by Wills Hill, first Marquis of Downshire and was later remodelled in the 19th and early 20th centuries. Today, it is a working royal palace functioning as the official residence of the Royal Family when they are in Northern Ireland, and it has been the home of the Secretary of State since the 1970s.

We will meet at 10.30am for morning coffee in the castle, with a guided tour of the state rooms, including the majestic Throne Room and graceful Drawing Room, at 11.15am. Lunch (soup and sandwiches) will be served at The Plough Inn by the castle entrance. Afterwards, Members are welcome to return to wander through 98 acres of beautiful gardens developed from the 1760s onwards, which offer a contrast of ornamental grounds, peaceful woodland, meandering waterways, and trimmed lawns. Features include a statue of Ossian outside the main entrance, the Lady Alice Temple, a Quaker burial ground and an ice house.
