

## COLLEGE NEWS

The College's 2017–2018 **University Challenge** team were victorious over St Hugh's College, Oxford, winning 170–155 in their first-round match on Monday 2 October on BBC Two. They also won their second-round match against Strathclyde University with a score of 170–106 on Monday 13 November. The team have secured a place in the prestigious quarter-final group stages of the competition, where the winning team are guaranteed at least two more matches. Edmund Derby, Kitty Chevallier, James Fraser and Alex Mistlin, played extremely well, and we are very proud of our continuing success on the programme; long may it continue!

Third-year undergraduate, **Emily Robb (2015)**, shared her experiences of starting at the University and College, with

the *Cambridge News*. She detailed how she went from being nervous before arriving at Emmanuel, and how she was welcomed by the College, through the 'parents' system, freshers' week events, and the warmth and friendliness of Emma itself.

The 2016–2017 University Challenge team, known online as #TeamEmma, played a match on BBC Two's *Eggheads* on Friday 15 September; it was up to **Jenny Harris (2008)** and **Alex Guttenplan (2008)** to take on the Eggheads' team in the final round. Perhaps one of the longest and most tense 'sudden death' rounds on this show, the Eggheads (led by six time World Champion Kevin Ashman) finally defeated Team Emma deep into proverbial 'stoppage time'.

## FELLOWS' NEWS

In October, **Dr Alexander Archibald** was part of an ACSIS (North Atlantic Climate System Integrated Study) aircraft field campaign, making measurements of the composition of the atmosphere from the UK to the Azores and around the North Atlantic.

**Dr Alan Baker** has published *Amateur Musical Societies and Sports Clubs in Provincial France, 1848–1914*, with Palgrave-Macmillan.

In the summer, **Dr James Hillson** published two articles regarding his research into Gothic architecture. His essay 'Imagining invention' was published in *British Art Studies*, and *Decorated Revisited* was published online by Brepols. He also advised on the production of the online digital model of St Stephen's Chapel, Westminster, which accompanies research from the University of York telling the story of a building at the heart of government in Britain for more than seven centuries.

**Dr Phil Howell**, discussed 'pets, how we interact with other species and how this has been represented in art and literature' on Radio Three's *Free Thinking*, recorded on Thursday 23 November.

On Thursday 19 October **Dr Alex Jeffrey** gave a speech at the Council of Europe in Strasbourg at the 33rd Session of the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities, in a debate about the future of elections in Mostar, Bosnia and Herzegovina.

**Dr Robert Macfarlane** has published *The Lost Words*, a new book of acrostic 'spell-poems'. The book 'stands against the disappearance of wild childhood ... [and] ... is a joyful celebration of nature words and the natural world they invoke'. It is accompanied by hand-painted illustrations by Jackie Morris.

## FELLOWS' NEWS (continued)

**Professor David Maxwell's** new book *Relocating World Christianity: Interdisciplinary Studies*, a combination of regionally focused case studies and thematic essays seeking to explain the emergence of World Christianity as a new academic sub-discipline over the last two decades, was published recently by Brill, and can be viewed online as an e-book.

**Professor Mark Thomson** has been elected co-leader of the international DUNE collaboration: a flagship global science project studying the properties of mysterious particles called neutrinos. He is the overall scientific lead of this new UK initiative that could change our understanding of the universe.

**Dr Vikas Trivedi** has been elected as the Deputy Editor of the Royal Microscopical Society's magazine *in focus*. The magazine provides a common forum for scientists and technologists who use any form of microscope and includes all branches of microscopy and cytometry.

**Dr Penny Watson** has been elected President of the European College of Veterinary Internal Medicine at the annual congress in Malta. The ECVIM is the European specialist college for the veterinary equivalent of consultant physicians, working under the regulations of the European Board of Veterinary Specialisation.

Dr James Fox (2001) will be giving the Emmanuel Society Lecture: *Blue*, at the Leighton House Museum, Holland Park Road, W14 8LZ, with a drinks reception in Leighton's Studio afterwards. The Silk Room, Arab Hall, Leighton's Dining Room and Drawing Room will be open for viewing before and after the lecture.

Dr Fox is a Research Fellow of Gonville & Caius College, the author of *British Art and the First World War, 1914–1924*, and BAFTA nominee for his BBC Four series *British Masters*.

The lecture will explain why blue is the world's favourite colour, ranging from Afghanistan to India and from Venice all the way to the dark side of the moon; exploring the vast and fascinating history of blue.
