Talk by Lord Puttnam – Wednesday 12 November 2014

David Puttnam has been an independent producer of award-winning films including *The Mission*, *The Killing Fields*, *Local Hero*, *Chariots of Fire*, *Midnight Express*, *Bugsy Malone* and *Memphis Belle*. His films have won ten Oscars, 25 Baftas and the Palme D'Or at Cannes. He now works as chair of Atticus Education, an online education company based in Ireland.

Lord Puttnam will give a talk in the Queen's Building at 5.30pm on Wednesday 12 November. The talk will be followed by a buffet supper in the Old Library.

History Day & AGM – Saturday 15 November 2014

The Society will hold a History Day in College on Saturday 15 November, with talks from Fellows in the morning and visits to the chapels of four colleges in the afternoon, to hear organ music and for a guided tour of their architecture.

The Emmanuel Society's AGM will be held in the morning at 10.30am in the Queen's Building Lecture Theatre. The Committee recommends the reappointment of Nigel

Quinton (1979) as a Committee member and the addition of Jug Parmar (1986). Another name might be suggested by the Committee shortly. If you would like to be notified of this, please email emmanuel-society@emma.cam.ac.uk or contact the Society Office.

Following the AGM, coffee will be served at 11am in the Harrods Room.

The History talks will start at 11.30am with Dr Geraint Thomas discussing World War I letters from the Emmanuel archive, Dr Julie Barrau talking about WWI views about Joan of Arc as a French symbol, Professor Liesbeth van Houts comparing WWI soldiers' oral memories with those of soldiers who fought in the Norman Conquest, and Professor David Maxwell considering WWI repercussions on contemporary German missionaries working in Africa.

A sandwich lunch will follow the History talks at 1pm in the Old Library.

At 2pm John Bryden (1965) will lead a tour of the chapels of Emma, Christ's, Sidney and Jesus to hear the organs and listen to readings of letters and biographies. John will also point out features of interest in each chapel.

The group will then return to the College for tea at 4.30pm.

'Moonflowers: Plants and the Imagination, from Ice Age Metaphors to Plant Intelligence', Talk by Richard Mabey – Friday 28 November 2014

Award-winning author Richard Mabey will give a talk at 5.30pm in the Queen's Building on Friday 28 November. Richard is spending Michaelmas Term in Emmanuel as a Derek Brewer Visiting Fellow. He won the East Anglia Book Award in 2010 for *Weeds: How Vagabond Plants Gatecrashed Civilisation* and the National Book Award in 1996 for *Flora Britannica*. He also writes for the *Guardian*, *New Statesman* and *Granta* and has a personal column in *BBC Wildlife* magazine.

The talk will be followed by a buffet supper in the Old Library.

A tour of Wotton House and its gardens in Aylesbury is planned for Saturday 6 June 2015.

The house is a Grade I-listed English Baroque building, which was rebuilt for Richard Grenville, 2nd Marquis of Buckingham by John Soane in the 1820s. The grounds were laid out by Capability Brown between 1750 and 1767.

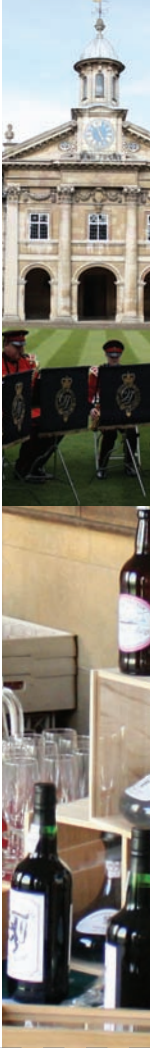
