Boat Club

On 17 October, Emma had five crews entered in the Cambridge Autumn Head and had some great results:

- WI was the fastest women's College VIII
- WII was the second fastest women's second boat
- MI raced in two fours, coming 8th and 11th of Men's college IVs
- MII was the third Men's second boat

The first major competition of the term, the University Fours, took place at the end of October; the Emmanuel WI beat Jesus and Selwyn to reach the semi-finals against Downing WI. The MI had a bye to the semi-finals against King's.

Access

It has been a busy term, with nearly 300 school students from ten different schools visiting to learn more about university and Cambridge. Twenty-four Year 9 and twelve Year 11 students participated in the Cambridge College Physics Experience day. The ECSU's annual shadowing scheme also took place during the school half-term break, with ten students from our link areas in Essex and Sheffield staying at Emmanuel for two nights. The scheme aims to let Year 12 students find out what it is really like to study at Cambridge

by attending lectures and supervisions, as well as participating in clubs and societies, with a current student mentor.

Over the last few weeks our Schools Liaison Officer has also been giving talks at school information evenings in Essex and speaking to students, parents and teachers at the Colchester Careers Convention in Weston Homes Community Stadium, which was attended by over 600 students.

Chapel Choir

The Choir have been singing a varied range of music this term, to accompany a series of sermons on themes of Community. Amongst these have been extracts from Mendelssohn's *Elijah*, Stanford in C, Palestrina and Haydn's *Te Deum*. They also sang Fauré's *Requiem* for the All Souls' Requiem on Thursday 5 November in the College Chapel. They have a packed schedule for the rest of term, and they will be leading Members and guests at the Emmanuel London Carol Service at St Mary le Bow on Tuesday 8 December.

Forthcoming events include a concert at St Martin's Church in Stamford, Lincolnshire on Saturday 12 December at 7.30pm. They will be singing Britten's much-loved *Ceremony of Carols* and other seasonal works by Mathias and Willcocks. They will be accompanied by harpist Eleanor Turner.

In 2016, they will perform Bach's St John Passion, in German, in the College Chapel on Sunday 6 March. They will be joined by Simon Wall (Evangelist) and Robert Rice (Christ), accompanied by The Little Baroque Company and directed by Richard Latham (1997).

ECSU

This year the aims of the Student Union was to bring ECSU and the Freshers' Reps together into a more cohesive Freshers' Team, as well as putting an emphasis on activities that provide an alternative to 'going out'. With the ongoing support of everyone in the College, our new first years are settling in well and getting involved in everything that College (and the University) has to offer!

Since Freshers' Week, the Committee have been working to re-grade all the undergraduate rooms and have been tying up loose ends of the year. Our Welfare Officers have busied themselves putting on the ever popular 'Tea and Cake' sessions, as well as free weekly yoga and mindfulness sessions. An International Formal is coming up, and the ECSU are also hosting the 'Good Lad Initiative', looking at positive masculinity in the University.

The Bar has had a successful term so far, with Ents and Bar Extensions being well attended and very popular. The new Bar Managers, Jess Lister and Musab Shamekh, are doing a sterling job! The Green Ducks (Emma's environmental sub-group) have been very busy this term, recently holding a successful Vintage Fashion Fair and cake sale in aid of the refuge crisis and local charity shops, as well as a popular Vegetarian Formal.
